

Day 1 Celebration of National Library Week

Date: 14 November 2025

The Central Library of Gujarat Technological University commenced the National Library Week celebrations with an engaging and inspiring Day 1 event that focused on promoting a culture of reading among students. The celebration opened with a thematic display of books curated from the library's diverse collection. The display highlighted a range of genres including fiction, self-development, technical literature, biographies, and competitive exam resources, attracting students from various departments.



Our Librarian, Dr. Mahesh Solanki, addressed the gathering and delivered an insightful motivational talk on the importance of regular reading. He emphasized how books enhance creativity, strengthen academic understanding, and contribute to overall personality development. Dr. Solanki encouraged students to cultivate reading as a daily habit, noting that libraries play a crucial role in shaping thoughtful and informed individuals.

Following this, Assistant Librarian, Mr. Chintan Vasava, guided students through the various reading and learning resources available at the Central Library. He explained the effective use of physical books, digital platforms, e-resources, and reference materials. Mr. Vasava highlighted how students can access journals, e-books, and online databases to support both academic and personal growth.



The event also featured an interactive sharing session, where students spoke about their personal reading experiences. They discussed the books that influenced them, the values they gained over the years, and how reading has contributed to their learning journey.



Report on Educational Visit to Ahmedabad International Book Festival 2025

As a part of the National Library Week Celebration 2025, the Central Library, Gujarat Technological University (GTU) organized an enriching educational visit to the Ahmedabad International Book Festival 2025 on 15th November 2025.
